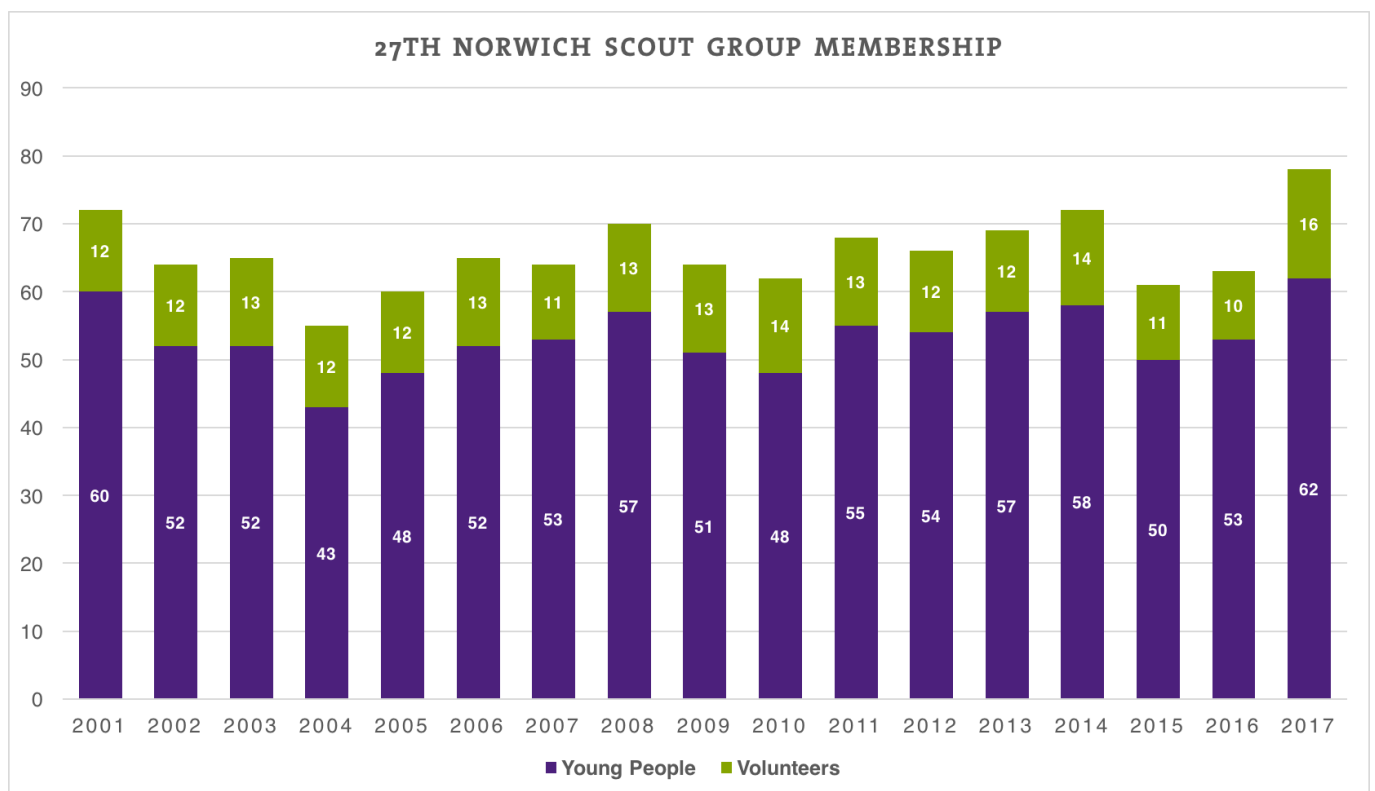

After our last AGM, we entered 2 teams of 6 (4 scouts & 2 cubs) into the Horsford Hike in November, with one team winning and the other coming a respectable fourth place. All the young people enjoyed the event and we will be entering another 2 teams again this year to retain our trophy!

We then organised an overnight sleep at the HQ where the scouts slept outside under their own shelters (mostly cardboard boxes), with the leaders who stayed spending a night under the stars.

Once again we organised our own annual Costessey Hike in February for mixed teams of cubs and scouts from across the district. 12 teams entered this year but the competition was stiff and although we didn't win, all the young people had a great time and were smiling in the end!

23 of our scouts attended the Water Activities Mayhem (WAM) district activity camp in June and took part in activities such as archery, air rifle shooting, sailing, rafting, kayaking, sit-on canoes, catapults, tomahawk throwing and crafts.

We entered 2 teams into the district shooting and archery competition, with 2 of our scouts being selected to represent Northern Norwich Scout District at the county archery finals. Unfortunately, the date for this clashed with the WAM camp and a large majority of the eligible scouts across the district preferred to be at the camp so the district was unable to raise a team.

As ever we've done a lot of badge work this year, with first aid, problem solving, map work, fire lighting (without matches or lighters) and cooking – including a "Ready, Steady, Cook" evening where the scouts are given a bag of food to make a meal from.

We've just seen 6 scouts move on to Explorer Scouts, with another 4 now moving up from Cub Scouts and have been approached by 2 young people from outside the group which now takes us to around 26 scouts.

We will be attending Norjam Scout Jamboree 2018 at the Norfolk show ground in August for a week. There will be around 3000 scouts and guides from around the world there. The troop are looking at ways to fundraise this to help reduce the cost to parents, any ideas for this would be gratefully appreciated.
